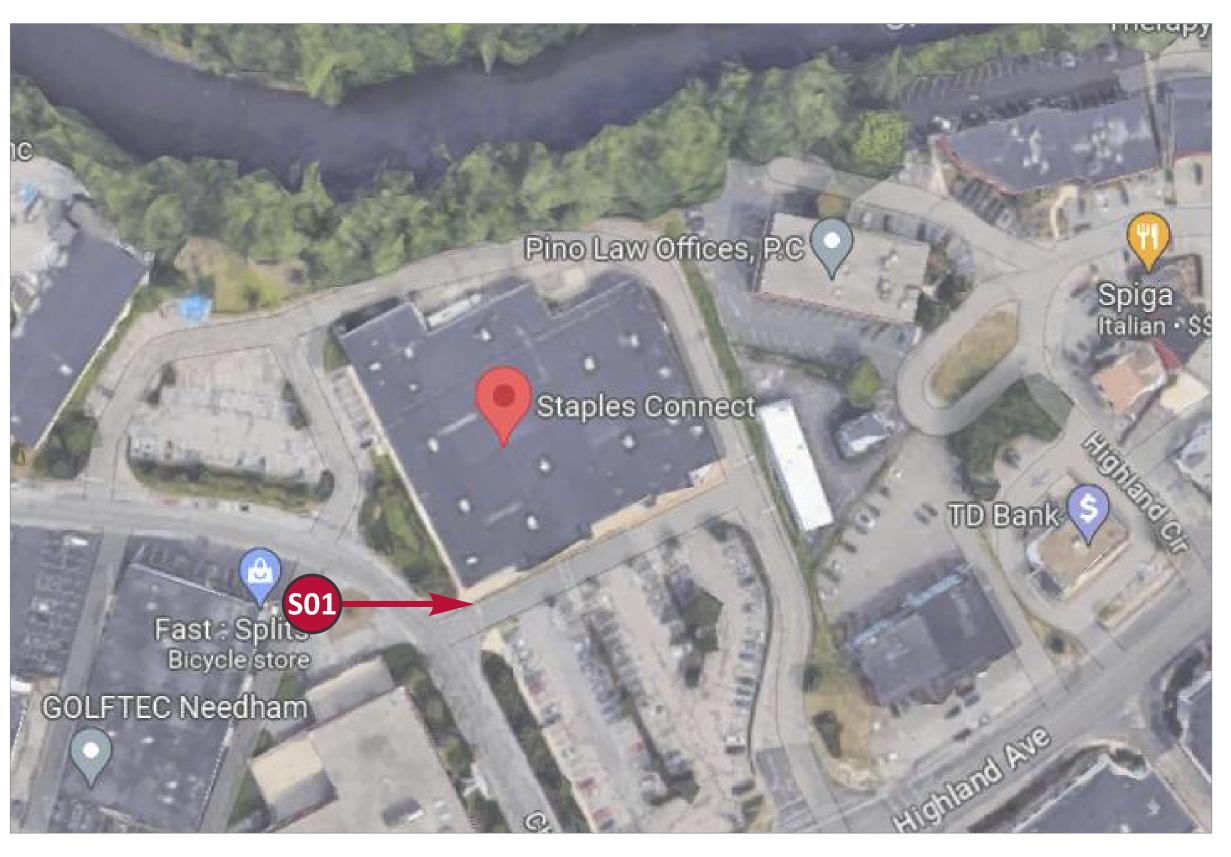

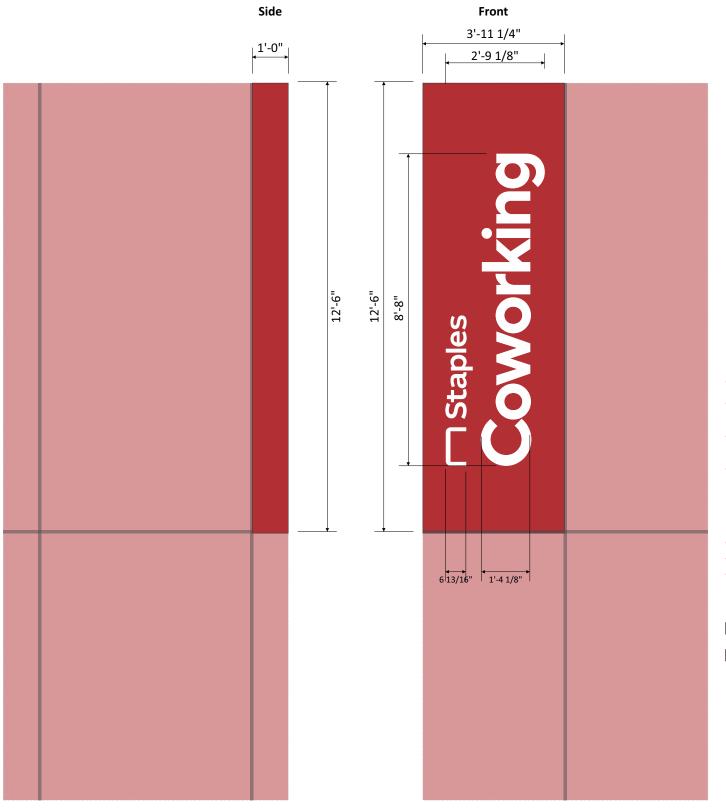

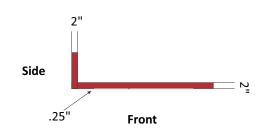

A few items of-note:

- Our architect added dimensions to the elevations and I uploaded the revised drawings to the Dropbox (together with all the other backup materials per the instructions).
- 2. I want to underscore that we're not seeking any changes to signage at this time, so many items on the checklist/instructions are "N/A" for this application.
- 3. This application is for 1257 Highland Ave. only; that said, 1299 Highland Ave. is important for contextual purposes, so renderings of that building were included to provide the additional context-- we'll seek approvals for 1299 Highland Ave. later, probably this winter (we're planning to do the remainder of the work in the spring 2025).
- 4. We are going to get with all of our tenants regarding signage strategy; we'll seek approvals on signage in a future DRB application (and Conrad's will be seeking an approval of its sign separately).
- 5. Conrad's installed the new accordion windows as part of its buildout project and can be seen in the photos in the Dropbox folder.
- 6. I included ALTA survey and 11/2022 layout plan as it also provides useful context.

I'll swing by this afternoon to drop off the \$25 application fee.

I think that should do it but, if I've missed anything (or if anything is unclear), please let me know and I'll provide asap.

We plan to submit a separate application for exterior changes to that building after we've clarified with the Building Commissioner whether proposed canopy-mounted signage will require a special permit from the DRB.
- 2. The owner of Conrad's Restaurant will be submitting a separate application for a new building sign and pylon sign panel at 1257 Highland Ave.
- 3. South Street 4414 Holdings LLC plans to submit follow-on application(s) for replacement building signage and pylon sign panels at both 1257 and 1299 Highland Ave.

Chapel St Mural Project

The location on Chapel St was identified in the Spring of 2024, after a lengthy search for a second available mural location, with property owners open to artwork on their building. The Chapel Street location was secured with the help of Roma Realty Trust and the Town's economic advisor and NCAC liaison, J.P. Cacciaglia. The location of the mural will be in a walkway on the side of a busy retail building located between Chapel Street and a commuter rail/commercial parking lot in the heart of downtown Needham. This location is adjacent to many thriving businesses, with a view of Town Hall as you enter Chapel St, and will be widely viewed. This work of art will be the first to be sited in this prominent business location which can be seen from the busy street and the parking lot and, of course, while traversing the alleyway. **See Map:**

Design Objective:

Arts and culture are powerful tools for communicating values, connecting neighborhoods, and inspiring a sense of unity for all who live, work, and visit. Mia Cross will create a mural that inspires, connects, and reflects the spirit and a point in time in the history of Needham.

Technical Specifications:

The approximate size of the painted wall for the mural project is 30 feet long by 11 feet high. It is important to note that the last few feet of the wall has pipes. The artist has designed around this. The paint used will be Sherwin Williams Exterior paints (acrylic latex house paints) and Montana and/or Gold brand spray paint (NC-acrylic). These are standard mural industry materials that last for decades.

Process: The base color will be applied with rollers to the entire span of the wall. The artist will then project and trace the mural piece by piece to accurately draw the design. From there, paint will be applied with brushes. She plans to utilize spray paints for a select number of details, a 6' baker's scaffold, and a short A frame ladder.

Projected Timeline:

Two weeks beginning on October 13th, weather dependent

Artist's Budget:

\$800 -Paint, spray paint, cups, brushes, rollers \$6200 Mural Installation/Artist Compensation

Mural Description by Mia Cross for: "Tight Knit"

To create this design, I started with a deep dive into Needham's history. I was immediately drawn to the bird journals of Needham naturalist Timothy Otis Fuller, and to Needham's historic ties to the knitting industry of the 19th and 20th centuries. In my work, I often explore the natural world and the connections it has with an artist or craft person's inclination (or need) to create with their hands. Here, I chose to illustrate a family of nesting Yellow Palm Warblers, as Fuller had a page dedicated to tracking their migration in one of his journals. And although the town's knitting industry relied mainly on machine work, the woman knitting by hand is an ode to the English Midlands immigrants who brought their knitting skills and knowledge to Needham in the 19th century in search of greater opportunity. In my mural, I imagine that the warblers and Needham's knitters have come together, working in harmony to build a place that both can call home.





Biography: Mia was born and raised in Framingham, MA. She launched her career in 2014 following her graduation from Boston University where she studied painting and sculpture. Cross has been the recipient of multiple grants, including a VSC Boston University Alumni Grant, the Blanche Colman Grant and a Mass MoCa Match Grant. Recent residencies include the Archipelago Residency in Kökar, Finland, the Facebook Artist in Residence

Program in Cambridge, MA, the Sasaki Artist in Residence Collaboration in Watertown, MA, the Vermont Studio Center Residency in Johnson, VT, and the Goetteman Residency at the Rocky Neck Art Colony in Gloucester, MA. Her work lives in private collections throughout the world and has recently been acquired by the Danforth Museum and Simmons University for their permanent collections. Cross splits her time between her studio work and mural work. She has created murals for the Rose Kennedy Greenway, Facebook Headquarters, Blick, the city of Framingham, Jack's Abby Brewery, Tiffany & Co., Google, and more. Her home and permanent studio are located in Providence, RI. You can see examples of her mural work on her website: http://www.miacross.com/murals-2

In Conclusion:

After receiving a dozen responses to the RFP for a call to Artists, the NCAC mural subcommittee discussed the submissions and selected three finalists to each create a site-specific design, with a \$300 honorarium each. A town-wide poll conducted of the 3 submissions collected close to 1,000 votes, with the majority going to "Tight Knit". https://polco.us/n/res/vote/needham-ma/which-of-the-following-mural-designs-do-you-feel-best-fits-the-alleyway-next-to-91-chapel-st

The sub-committee met again, along with three community members, including a Chapel Street store owner, a nearby resident and an art student from NHS. The discussion then went to the entire NCAC for a final decision. Keeping in mind the results of the poll and the subcommittee discussion, the decision was made that "Tight Knit" would be the most suitable for that space, creating a visual flow of colors, depicting part of our town's history, and including a bucolic natural landscape.

There will be a frame around the sign. The lights above the 30 existing sign are proposed to be removed. The glass under the existing sign will not be changed. 31 32 Chair Gluesing noted that there is wording shown on the windows in the online presentation that 33 was not included with the plans the Board received. The purpose of the Sign Bylaw is to identify 34 a business in its location. Some general wording on the windows to give a generic description 35 would be acceptable. The Board would likely not approve the wording as shown but would 36 consider alternate wording as a separate submission. 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Agenda Item 2:

Anna Haluch, Pro Sign Service LLC representing Ayr Wellness located at 29 Franklin Street and applying for signage.

Anna Haluch, Pro Sign Service LLC, stated that Ayr Wellness will be moving into this location. The proposal is to place a sign above the main front entrance. The front lit channel letter set is proportional to the sign band above. The raceway will be painted to match the façade. The main entrance will have perforated vinyl so that those outside cannot see inside, but those inside will be able to see out. The other vinyl on the windows is blue without lettering in order to cover up the inside of the store. The company name and store hours are proposed to be placed on the door.

Chair Gluesing stated that there are limitations for 25% of the area of a glass panel to be filled with information. The signage portion is okay, but this would typically go on a clear door. An opaque panel is close to being a façade change instead of a sign area. Other Board members did not consider this a significant change.

Upon motion duly made by Mr. Dornbusch and seconded by Ms. Opton, it was voted to approve
 the sign application for Ayr Wellness located at 29 Franklin Street as submitted. Steve

Agenda Item 3:

Bryan Bonina, Signarama-Walpole representing The Run House to be located at 943 Great Plain Avenue and applying for signage.

Bryan Bonina, Signarama-Walpole explained that the proposal is for a ½" thick PVC double-sided panel sign with graphics applied to each side which will hang from the previous sign location for Three Crown Jewelers.

Chair Gluesing stated that most of the projecting signs in this location, or others, have had an anchor chain from the lower right-hand corner. Mr. Bonina stated that this can be applied, if needed. Chair Gluesing stated that he would like an anchor stabilizing chain as a condition of approval.

Upon motion duly made by Mr. Dornbusch and seconded by Ms. Opton, it was voted to approve the sign application for The Run House located at 943 Great Plain Avenue, with the condition that a small anchor chain be added from the sign to the building. Steve Dornbusch – aye; Chair Gluesing – aye; Milee Pradham – aye; Susan Opton – aye; Motion passed 4-0-0.

Agenda Item 4:

Reginald Foster, Needham Housing Authority and Bargmann Hendrie + Archetype design presenting Linden Chambers Redevelopment Project.

Reginald Foster, Chair of the Needham Housing Authority, stated that the Housing Authority is in the middle of a program to modernize all of its 316 aging housing units in Needham. This

proposal is to remove 72 aging apartments at the Linden Street development and replace them with 136 new units.

Dan Chen, Architect with BH + A, explained that the site plan review submission is scheduled for later this month on August 26th with the goal of having the Planning Board hearing in September. The public has been engaged in this process and comments are being sought from all stakeholders. Regarding the existing conditions, the project deals with two sites which are contiguous to each other. The Linden site has 18 buildings built around 1959-1962 and the Chamber site has five, two story buildings. The buildings are in fairly poor condition and, as the demographic of the units is an elderly population, accessibility becomes particularly important. The units are approximately 400 s.f. studios, which are significantly under sized for today's standards. The site presents some challenges particularly with adjacency to wetlands and a Notice of Intent is being filed through the Conservation Commission. The goal of the project is to improve the living standards of the residents and the site.

The zoning requirements for the proposal include a height maximum of 58', a maximum number of four-story buildings, with an FAR of 0.5, a maximum number of 25 dwelling units per acre, and 0.5 parking spaces per unit. The buildings proposed are four stories with an FAR 0.36 and a height of 53'. To build Phase 1A 40 units of residents will have to be relocated. The phases will be built in sequence. Phase 1A includes 76 units, primarily one-bedroom units, averaging 600 s.f. Phase 1B includes 60 units. Both buildings will be four stories. The Linden Street site will include 70 parking spaces and two fire lanes. There is a detailed landscaping plan. Lights poles are proposed in the parking lot and along the fire lane. There will also be pedestrian scaled site lighting. The fixtures will be dark sky compliant and downcast. The package contains a detailed list of materials proposed for the buildings.

The committee first discussed the site organization and landscaping. The Board discussed the location of the proposed buildings to the nearby wetlands. Mr. Chen explained that lawn will not be established in the back of the buildings and native plantings are proposed. All of the runoff from the site will go through the underground storage area in the parking lot. Outside of the two subsurface stormwater management systems on site, a low point will be graded into one of the lawns to create a swale, but it is not large enough to be considered a detention area. Ms. Pradham suggested there be a consideration for additional paved walks throughout the site to make the site pedestrian friendly.

Ms. Opton noted that proximity of the site to the school across the street. She asked about intermingling the two communities by making more small, intimate spaces on the site. Some of the seniors that live in this community love to watch the children play on the adjacent sports field and the proposal includes seating areas along Linden Street to facilitate this.

 Ms. Opton asked about potentially burying telephone poles in the area. Mr. Chen stated that the poles are will remain. A new transformer will be brought on site to service the buildings. Ms. Opton asked about the mix of trees along the Linden Street roadway. It was noted that there will be a mix of trees along the street. The species options are included in the planting plan. Ms. Opton suggested rabbit-resistant plants in the planting beds.

- 137 Chair Gluesing noted that the amenities are very high for this project which is wonderful. The
- 138 project will need to determine how the Fire Department can get what they need on the site.
- 139 Regarding surfaces, he has previously seen some success with mitigating the width by using a
- 140 stamped concrete material or some sort of accent at the edges. If possible, extend the walking
- 141 path visually through the drives. He echoed Ms. Pradham's comment regarding continuing the
- 142 path towards the garden area on the south and then into the new development if they can find a
- 143 way. A surface change, impression, or paint may be a nice feature for this. The proposed patio
- 144 and community room will be a real asset. He asked if there will be a larger mix of age groups in
- 145 the new facility. Mr. Foster stated that this will continue to be senior housing only.

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- Chair Gluesing suggested breaking up the massing of the buildings a bit more using the different materials, if possible. Ms. Pradham stated that the mirroring of the front entry at the back is
- 148 149 successful. The larger wings' elevations could be broken up a bit more. Mr. Chen noted that the
- 150 ceiling heights make some of this difficult but there is additional work to do on the back building
- elevation design. The applicant stated they expect to develop the material mix in the elevations 151
- 152 more to help break down the scale.

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- 154 Ms. Opton agreed that the proposal has a large footprint to what currently exists on the site.
- 155 Something to break this up would be useful. The building is broken into gabled sections with
- 156 connector sections. These sections are angled relative to each other to help break up the building
- 157 scale.

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- 159 Mr. Chen agreed that the height and massing of the proposed buildings is recognized compared
- 160 to the existing. The intention is to pull back from the Linden Street frontage while also being
- sensitive to the Maple Street neighbors. Mr. Dornbusch suggested a larger contrast of materials 161
- 162 on the Maple Street side of the buildings to help break up the massing.

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The Board approves of the general design, and a memo will be issued to the Planning Board with their comments.

At 30 the corner of Great Plain Avenue and Maple Street, the proposal is to install the company logo on a small of the building, with the hours on the front door. On the Maple Street side, the 31 32 proposal is for a smaller sign, and also a window graphic. The panel signs include 1/4" thick 33 printed raised letters on an aluminum background to be installed on the existing spandrel panels. 34 The graphics on the windows and on the door are flat and white. 35 Mr. Dornbusch asked if there is any illumination proposed. Mr. Cohen stated that there are 36 37 existing wall lights, but no other illumination is proposed. 38 39 Mr. Dornbusch asked if the window signs are necessary, with all the other signage proposed. Mr. 40 Cohen stated that the window signs are mostly for pedestrian traffic. 41 42 Ms. Opton asked about including the website on the sign. Chair Gluesing agreed that sign by-law

is meant to identify a business in its location, so a website notation is not usually allowed. Mr.

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Cohen stated that this can be eliminated.

- 46 Ms. Pradham asked about the proportion of the sign and the different panels. Chair Gluesing
- 47 stated the sign on panel A is 35% larger than on panel C and generally the Board likes to see the

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Agenda Item 1:

Mike Cohen, Signs by J, representing the Needham School Administration Building located at 1330 Highland Avenue and applying for graphic signage.

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Mike Cohen, Signs by J, explained that the proposal is to install a 52" non-illuminated, aluminum circle with a printed logo for the Needham High School Administration Building.

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Ms. Opton asked about the proposed white logo on the existing white background panel. Chair Gluesing stated that there appears to be a 1.1' white raised trim piece, leading into the recessed aluminum panel. The sign will fill a recessed area where a clock used to sit.

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Mr. Dornbusch stated that he finds the proposed sign to be appropriate for the building.

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Ms. Pradham asked if the proposed sign is the same size as the clock. Mr. Cohen stated that the blue background is the same size as the clock was.

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Mr. Zemel expressed concern regarding the font of the "N" in the sign. Chair Gluesing stated that this is part of the Town's new branding scheme.

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Chair Gluesing stated that he appreciates the mounting information provided. He cautioned about measuring the actual recess to make sure it is correct. Mr. Cohen stated that this would be done.

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Upon motion duly made by Mr. Dornbusch and seconded by Ms. Opton, it was voted to approve the sign panel to be installed in the pediment of the Emery Grover Building, as submitted. Steve Dornbusch – aye; Chair Gluesing – aye; Felix Zemel – aye; Milee Pradham – aye; Susan Opton - aye; Motion passed 5-0-0.

Agenda Item 2:

Steve Schwede, FastSigns, representing Soni Kim, owner of 117-119 Chestnut Street and applying for signage.

Steve Schwede, FastSigns, explained that the proposed ground mounted sign has to be 15' from the street and the sign is 65" wide. The sign may be pulled back a bit further, they have to work with an existing light post. The sign is made out of an ACM material with vinyl lettering on each side. The sign background is proposed to be white but could also be a light gray. The sign will sit on aluminum posts and there are two sides to the sign, based on the existing two tenants. Another sign is proposed on the building, as one cannot see the post and panel sign from the nearby stoplight. This second sign would face School Steet.

Chair Gluesing noted that the Board has previously allowed pylon signs on Chestnut Street in addition to building signs because the buildings are somewhat setback, though this one is not as much. The Building Inspector will determine whether he wants to have a Special Permit hearing for the second sign, but the Board can review it now and give some feedback. Mr. Schwede stated that this will also be an ACM sign with vinyl lettering.

Mr. Zemel stated that a light gray color for the sign might be better, due to the amount of traffic in the area and the dirt that may get kicked up. He agreed with reviewing both signs this evening and then leaving the Special Permit process up to the Building Inspector.

114 It was noted that the Building Inspector will require a special permit for the sign on the building.

116 Mr. Dornbusch agreed that a light gray color sign would be best.

118 Ms. Pradham asked about the building sign and a gray border around it on the plan. It was noted that this is a Photoshop issue, but this coloring does not exist on the building.

121 Chair Gluesing stated that the building sign is okay and will need to go through the permitting 122 process. The two signs are under the 32 s.f. allowance, but, at 5.5' wide they seem large, though 123 the lettering is modest. He agreed with a proposed light gray color, instead of white.

Upon motion duly made by Mr. Dornbusch and seconded by Ms. Opton, it was voted to approve the primary ground mounted building sign with the condition that the background color be a pale gray. Steve Dornbusch – aye; Chair Gluesing – aye; Felix Zemel – aye; Milee Pradham – aye; Susan Opton – aye; Motion passed 5-0-0.

- **Agenda Item 3:**
- Jason White, RSL Architect, representing Dedham Savings Bank to be located at 695 Highland
 Avenue and applying for site plan review.

- Jason White, RSL Architect, presented the proposed project of renovating the existing building
- which is currently vacant. The project will enhance the existing facility with no expansion except
- the drive thru canopy. A new parapet will be installed at the front entrance, along with a new
- glass storefront. Decorative graphic images are proposed on both sides of the existing brick

walls. The brick will be painted a light gray color, and the facia will be resurfaced and painted a lighter color. A red vinyl will be applied to the glass storefront to create a graphic look. An ATM is proposed on an island in the parking lot, which will be moved from its current location to allow for a larger turning radius. The traffic flow of the site should stay the same. The existing canopy posts will be replaced to better match the building.

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Mr. Zemel asked about the two square areas on the south elevation, and if they would be considered signs, requiring a Special Permit. Chair Gluesing stated that this is likely the case.

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- Mr. Zemel stated that the proposed enhancements may make the existing site conditions worse.
- The exit from the front parking area is tight at the corner and he asked about mitigating the
- traffic flow in this area. The applicant team noted that the site is tight, but the proposal will
- improve upon this. Additional traffic signage can be introduced, as needed. Chair Gluesing stated
- that a planting island will help this space, but it will still be a tight area. He noted that this project
- will be going before the ZBA for review and the Board will send comments along.

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Ms. Opton stated that there is no need for a grass flat area in the island as proposed. A different planting that does not need to be mowed could be considered. She expressed concern with unsightly planting beds impacted by snow plowing will become taken over by weeds. Some of the proposed plantings may be overtaken by others.

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Ms. Pradham stated that the two new understory trees proposed could instead be shade trees to combat the amount of hardscape on this site. She suggested the 2 trees both be installed along Highland Avenue. She agreed with removing the proposed lawn area and planting short grasses or perennials. She asked about the lights shown on the south elevation plan. The applicant team stated that one of the lights is existing on the building for illuminating the parking area. The second is decorative and will be used to illuminate the graphic panel.

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Chair Gluesing asked about the vinyl graphic images to be displayed. The applicant team explained that this will be a local community image. Chair Gluesing stated that these vinyl images will need to be applied for separately. He stated that he likes the idea of extending the canopy and installing real brick pillars, along with the proposed portico canopy. He agreed with the previous suggestion of removing the grass area and instead installing shrubs or native grasses.

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Ms. Opton asked about proposed irrigation. Mr. White stated that there is not an existing system, and this has not yet been discussed. Ms. Opton also suggested river rock or decorative bollards to create an edging area along the east side of the site instead of plantings if the beds are narrow.

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The Board agreed to draft all comments and send them to the ZBA.
