On the contrary, Cynthia Ganung and Amelia Klein also reported that the presentation from Assistant Principal, NHS, Johnny Cole at the Diversity Summit on the Equity Report was very well received.

A discussion regarding this feedback followed with NPS Superintendent Dan Gutekanst He explained that parents and community was made aware about the progress on The Equity Report via emails, Town Cable TV and School Meetings. He was open to suggestions for additional ways of increasing awareness and timely dissemination of information. He will raise this issue at the school committee. Jen will also bring this up at the REAL meeting.
