PROGRAMMATIC SERVICES:

VIP (Valuable Interaction among Peers) Program

- One on one mentoring program by high school students using games and arts/crafts for socialization skills serving 3rd, 4th and 5th graders.
- Maria and Katy working jointly on interviewing the high school applicants. (9 Seniors graduating so now in full recruitment mode)
- Programs runs yearly from the end of October April at the Center at the Heights. Katy coordinates with help from Maria; Adina Alpert assisted January-April, former intern that we hired for this project
- Designed to help kids with the emotional and social aspects of elementary school.
- Several high school students are graduating who will be recognized at May 10 Award Ceremony.
- Program is 6 years old pairing 15-18 students. We emphasize one-on-one but occasionally the "littles" will ask to expand to other pairs for board games such as Clue and if they initiate the request the "bigs"/mentors will agree.
- Is Board Interested in expanding the program to include 6th graders who have asked but who have aged out of the program? Westwood has a larger program but it has been in existence longer. Discussion ensued including renaming so there is a more intuitive connection; No decision made on expanding right now.

Additional updates given:

- Our Summer Brochure is updated and being publicized, summer registration began on May 1st. Extreme Looks, Junior Police Academy and Project Van are all filling up.
- Publicity and registration have also begun for Peer Tutor and VIP.
- Senior Award Ceremony for all seniors in VIP and Peer Tutor will be recognized tomorrow evening, May 10th.
- Third trimester of Picture Perfect will take place in a few weeks.
- We are mid-way through Teen Dating Violence Seminars at the high school. We have partnered with REACH beyond Domestic Violence to bring these workshops to all 9th graders.
- We are planning an intergenerational picnic with Aging Services for August (see flyer)

CLINICAL SERVICES:

Counseling and the Law:

An overview was given regarding laws as they relate to counseling.

• HIPAA and FERPA were explained.

- Youth & Family Services use 3 forms to obtain parental consent
 - -Consent for Counseling
 - o -Release of Information for Schools
 - Authorization for Electronic Communication---
- A discussion of how these forms are used was had
- In answer to Board member questions--any self-harm questions we do a risk assessment then refer to Riverside as needed with a call to the parents at the same time.
- All Division Staff are covered by Katy's license; and Katy has full coverage from the Town of Needham.
- Tim McDonald, Director of Health & Human Services explained at the board's request how the coverage works: The Town is self-insured as a government entity. Town defends any practitioners in Court, there is a cap on damages and there a very high standard to prove any case brought by an individual/group.
- Explanation of CRA[CRA-Child Requiring Assistance Program)

5 categories but last 2 are only in the schools

- -runaway child
- -stubborn child *** category that Youth sees most frequently
- -sexually exploited child
- -school offender
- -school truant

Additional updates given:

- Katy will be attended the Instructor training for Youth Mental Health First Aid next week in Hartford, CT
- Internship Collaborative with Dedham, Medfield, and Westwood has ended for the year
- Groups at Pollard are still in progress and are going well.
- We have received more counseling referrals...we currently have 6 children on our waitlist
- We continue to receive SAAP & BIP referrals and are making progress

COMMUNITY COLLABORATION:

- Provided 2 additional community consultations this month
 - o Grief workshop at the high school
 - Teen support and parent support
- Youth Resource Network held another successful roundtable this month. We are in the process of helping the family that was presented with resources
- Solution Committee meetings continue to meet. We currently sit on 3 committees
 - The Employee Mentoring is moving forward training mentors, next will be matching Mentees
 - o Conducted a values exercise with the Finance Department
- Domestic Violence Action Committee meetings meet monthly
 - Will hold a table at the Street Fair Saturday June 2nd.
- We have been asked to help train Park & Recreation summer staff
- We applied for and received a \$500 grant from BID-Needham, this will be used to bring The Mask You Live In to the Needham community.

ADMINSTRATIVE

- Our full budget request has been approved by town meeting
- We are in the process of filling board vacancies as Jack and Vin will be leaving us
 - o Annie Stein will begin her term on June 1, 2018
 - o Shayan's term has been extended until June 1, 2019
 - o It was discovered that David's term has expired and we have asked the school committee to extend his term until June 1st
 - o This is Vin's last official board meeting and Chief Schlitler will be appointing the new SRO, Adriene Anderson to our board stating June 1st. Thank you Vin for 32 years of service!
