Welcoming New Members - Rinaz Mala, Emme Ward (Needham High School student)

<u>Public participation</u> - Alyssa Kence, Beth Israel Deaconess Hospital in Needham
She had a presentation about the Community Health Needs Assessment and Community Listening
Session Overview,

Who are they? they are a non-profit hospital and as a non-profit hospital they are required by the state and the federal government to invest money in the community to address unmet health needs. Their goals? are to prioritize health -related and social needs of those living in BID Needham community Benefits Service Area and work with community- based organizations, leaders and residents to ensure the project is collaborative and engaging. They have done community surveys; key informants interviews focus groups.

What do they need from NHRC? They would like to reach more diverse demographics because they will have community listening sessions on February 2nd, 2022, at 9:30am and February 8th, 2022, at 3:30pm both virtual. They would like us to attend and promote these sessions. Alyssa was wondering if the NHRC could co-host one of the sessions to promote the event and help recruit residents' facilitators. They are trying to have community facilitators not the hospital. They have two training sessions for the community facilitators in January.

Tina asked about the data and who compiles the data? They have a consulting firm that compiles data, then the hospital put a three-year implementation strategy plan to address the needs of the community.

Marlene endorsed HRNC cosponsoring them because people's health is a human right.

Jennifer: suggests if we can have a different timing for the listening sessions (maybe an evening) so we can accommodate the time of people who have a full-time job.

Bud: also agrees with Marlene. How can we assist in promoting this program to a specific population? Reaching out to the houses of worship. Note. Alyssa met with the Needham Clergy Association.

Amelia: What information does Alyssa need? How can we help her? And she also agrees that we should be part of this initiative? if this only applies to Needham residents, do people who come to schools in Needham qualify? Have you touched based on the council of aging and the board of health? The answer was yes, everyone who works and/or lives in Needham.

Cynthia: suggested Nicole Argo who knows a lot about people who might not have their voices heard. One way of reaching out is through the employers or places of work,

Rinaz, suggested sending fliers through the donations that goes from the resiliency garden group on a weekly basis to promote the BID plan.

Kerry, second the timings should be different so more people can attend.

Alyssa provided her contact information if people would like to reach out to her,

All members voted on co-sponsoring the initiative for the listening sessions of BID Needham.

• Massachusetts Association of Human Rights commission (MAHRC):

Marlene, this group meets once a month on Friday, they meet on Zoom . they had so many discussions about the complaint process which might lead us to revising some of our ideas regarding the complaint proves. These are human rights group from all over MA , we can learn a lot from them . Another town had one person who took this mission and they attended every month and they reported back what was going on like what Educational Groups have done, or we could send one person to present the race critical theory or putting together something like policing and learn what did these groups do regarding these topics. it is very important to be part of that table.

Cynthis thinks this a great idea, people should take turns in attending these meetings.

Amelia it would be great to also have the yearly topics. if we see the agenda that would help too.
