## Update on COVID-19 From the Town of Needham and Needham Public Health

April 16, 2020 – The Town of Needham and Needham Public Health today provided the following update regarding COVID-19.

## **State DPH COVID-19 Numbers**

The Massachusetts Department of Public Health is reporting that as of April 16, 2020 there are:

- 32,181 cases statewide
- 3,342 cases Norfolk County
- 1,245 deaths statewide
- 114 cases in Needham (as reported by DPH on 4/15)
