## Update on COVID-19 From the Town of Needham and Needham Public Health

April 17, 2020 – The Town of Needham and Needham Public Health today provided the following update regarding COVID-19.

# **State DPH COVID-19 Numbers**

The Massachusetts Department of Public Health is reporting that as of April 17, 2020 there are:

- 34,402cases statewide
- 3,499 cases Norfolk County
- 1,404 deaths statewide
- 114 cases in Needham (as reported by DPH on 4/15)

#### SeeClickFix Still Available for Public Works Issues

Department of Public Works crews are still hard at work during this time. Powerful storms this week knocked down trees and created other debris in roadways that required cleanup from these workers.
