**GENERAL PLANTING NOTES**

1. Verify locations of all below-grade utilities prior to any excavation.
2. Report any discrepancies between drawings and field conditions to landscape architect prior to planting.
3. No plant substitutions without prior approval by Landscape Architect.
4. Tree and shrub locations and edges of planting beds to be staked by contractor. Stake locations to be adjusted as needed and approved by landscape architect prior to planting.
5. Plants shall comply with the sizing and grading standards of the latest edition of "American Standards for Nursery Stock". Provide stock true to botanical name and legibly tagged. Plants shall be delivered free of defects, diseases and all forms of insect infestations.
6. All plants are to be planted to same depth as at place of growth.
7. All trees and shrubs are to be mulched with 3 inches and all perennial and groundcover beds are to be mulched with 1 1/2 inch well rotted, finely shredded bark mulch or shredded bark mulch/leaf mold mixture. A sample of mulch is to be approved by landscape architect.
8. All artificial burlap and twine and/or wire baskets to be completely removed from root balls at time of installation.
9. Contractor shall have representative soil samples tested by a government agency and shall correct deficiencies and/or imbalances as per the testing agency's recommendations. Contractor shall furnish soil report to owner and landscape architect.
10. Topsoil for planting beds shall be conditioned as necessary and shall be fertile, friable, natural topsoil of loamy character, without admixture of subsol material, reasonably free of lumps, stones, plants, roots, and other foreign matter.
