Scope of Work	
Under the direction of the Children's Supervisor, the Children's Librarian will perform a variety of activities as an information resource to the community and plan and execute Children's Programs.

Essential Job Functions

An employee in this position may be called upon to do any or all of the following essential functions. These examples do not include all of the duties which the employee may be expected to perform. To perform this job successfully, an individual must be able to perform each essential function to satisfaction.

- Advise and assist patrons, both children and adults, in selecting, locating, and utilizing library
 resource materials through knowledge of print materials, the computerized catalog, electronic
 databases, and the Internet, instructing patrons in the use of these resources.
- Assist patrons with the ever-changing variety of library equipment, including tablets, AWE computers, game tables, Chrome books, laptops, Science, Technology, Engineering, Art, and Math (STEAM) resources, and other technologies, as they are introduced.
- Provide answers to patron's questions, both ready reference or in greater bibliographic depth, provide reader's advisory services, place holds for patrons, and provide information to patrons on library policies, activities, facilities, rules, and services.
- Establish, plan, and execute children's programming that will support the library's Long-Range Plan.
- Evaluate, weed, and develop assigned sections of the Children's Room Materials Collections.
- Assist the Children's Supervisor in providing outreach programs, services and library tours to local schools, preschools, and community organizations.
- Work with the Children's Supervisor to coordinate volunteer activities.
- Update and maintain the Children's Department web page, assisted by another Children's Department team member.
- Create and organize book lists and displays.
- Assist in processing library materials for circulation.
- Actively participate in professional library network committees and activities, including appropriate
 Minuteman Library Network committees and roundtables. Attend professional meetings, seminars,
 and continuing educational opportunities as they arise.

• Assume responsibility for the Children's Room in the absence of the Children's Supervisor.

Other Job Functions

- Performs related duties as assigned.
- Follow safe work practices.

Requirements of Work

- Position requires a master's degree in Library and Information Science.
- Position requires 1-3 years' experience in professional library children's service, children's programming experience is a plus.

Necessary Special Requirements

Physical Demands

- Frequent standing, walking, bending, reaching.
- Substantial lifting of books and related library materials and moving of book carts around the department up to and including 45 pounds.
- Regular use of computer keyboards, requiring eye-hand coordination and finger dexterity.
- Work subject to regular interruptions, constant high public traffic volume, noise, odors.
- Some travel by personal automobile through Needham and to neighboring towns.
- Evening and weekend work required.
